Sort More!

We need your help to maximize recycling efforts. Here's how you can contribute:

- Don't mix different types of waste.
- Empty and flatten packaging.
- Sort multi-material packaging based on the heaviest material.
- Place food waste in the designated brown paper bag.
- Tie residual waste bags securely. Ensure nothing recyclable goes in here!



YES

Daily newspapers, weekly newspapers, magazines, catalogues, leaflets, brochures, printer paper, drawing paper, paperbacks.

NO

Paper bags, cartons, gift wrap, plastic-coated paper, envelopes, Post-it notes, hardcover books.



YES

Pasta and cereal packages, pizza boxes, drink cartons, paper sacks, paper bags, cardboard boxes, gift wrap.

NO

Envelopes, Post-it notes, newspapers, flyers.



YES

Plastic bottles and cans, plastic bags and pouches, plastic tubes, plastic lids, refill packs, plastic foil, chip bags, styrofoam, interior bags, for example from cereal boxes.

NO

Non-packaging plastics, plastic toys, plastic buckets, electronics.



YES

Clear glass bottles, clear glass jars.

NO

Metal lids and screw caps, window and mirror glass, drinking and decorative glasses, crushed glass, porcelain and ceramics, light bulbs, and other light sources.



YES

Colored glass bottles, colored glass jars.

NO

Metal lids and screw caps, window and mirror glass, drinking and decorative glasses, crushed glass, porcelain and ceramics, light bulbs, and other light sources.

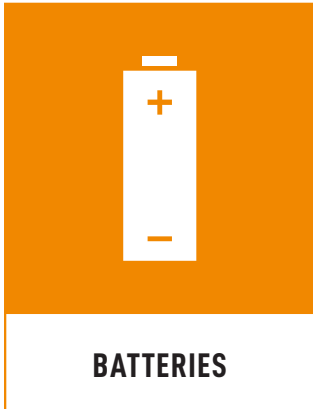


YES

Tin cans, empty spray cans, metal tubes, bottle caps, metal lids, empty paint cans, tealight holders, outdoor candle holders, aluminum foil.

NO

Scrap metal, frying pans, skillets, paint cans with contents, spray cans with contents.

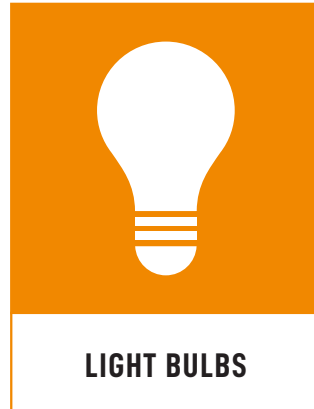


YES

Small batteries, watch batteries, rechargeable batteries.

NO

Car batteries, electric bike batteries, built-in batteries, battery chargers.



YES

Light bulbs, low-energy bulbs, LED bulbs, fluorescent tubes that are shorter than 60 cm.

NO

Fluorescent tubes that are longer than 60 cm, lamps without a light source, e.g. table lamps, ceiling lamps, and floor lamps, electronics with built-in light sources, e.g. flashlights and LED tealights.



YES

Fluorescent tubes that are longer than 60 cm.

NO

Incandescent bulbs, low-energy bulbs, LED bulbs, other light sources shorter than 60 cm.

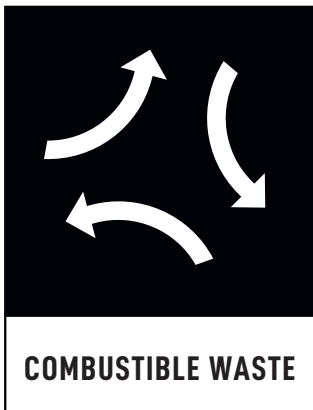


YES

Mobile phones, electric toothbrushes, small electric toys, cords, cables, chargers, computers, printers, smaller household appliances and tools, light fixtures (remove the light source!).

NO

Batteries, car batteries, light bulbs, fluorescent tubes.



YES

Small combustible items (excluding packaging), wood, rubber, work gloves, binders, plastic-coated paper, broken tools and toys made of plastic.

NO

Materials larger than 75 cm, porcelain, textiles, metal, chemicals, paint cans, white goods.



YES

Small non-combustible items, drinking glasses, mirror glass, items made of leather, porcelain, ceramics, clay, frying pans, skillets, mixed materials such as umbrellas, shovels, kitchen knives.

NO

Materials larger than 75 cm, chemicals, paint cans, car tires, white goods, hazardous waste.

Thank You for Sorting Your Waste!

Your efforts benefit both the environment and your wallet. Together, we can make a difference and keep our recycling spaces organized with simple, eco-friendly actions.

Sort household waste as food waste or residual waste



YES

Bread, pasta, rice, vegetables, fruit, meat, fish, shellfish, eggshells, tea leaves, tea bags, coffee grounds, coffee filters, small quantities of uncolored paper towels.

NO

Dust, ice cream/chopsticks/barbecue sticks, wine corks, soil, flowers, cat litter, pet litter, printed/colored napkins, diapers, pads, cigarettes, ash.



YES

Diapers, plaster, tops, envelopes, Post-it notes, dust, vacuum cleaner bags, cat litter, pet litter, napkins, wet wipes, cigarettes, ash.

NO

Hazardous waste, medicines, packaging, newspapers, batteries, small electronics, light sources, fluorescent tubes, food waste.

Take other waste to the environmental station, recycling center, pharmacy, and secondhand shops

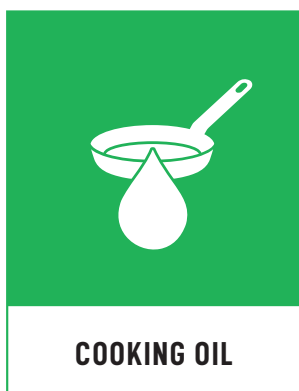


Hazardous waste such as paint, nail polish, chemicals, solvents, gas tubes, gas cartridges and spray cans with contents must always be left at the environmental station or recycling center.



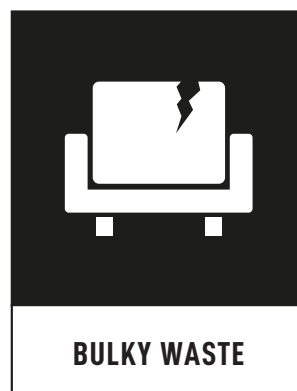
Pharmaceuticals are taken to the pharmacy.

You can sort empty pharmaceutical packaging as usual based on type of material.



Small amounts of cooking oil are wiped off with paper towels and placed in the food waste.

Larger quantities are collected in a plastic bottle and taken to the environmental station, recycling center, or placed in residual waste.



Large and heavy items that do not fit in the containers in the recycling room must be left at the recycling center.

Please try to reconsider whether it can be donated or reused instead.



Leave whole and clean items that work in the neighborhood exchange room/corner if there is one. Or take to secondhand shops and charitable organizations.

Worn-out textiles are taken to an environmental station or recycling center.



Return cans and plastic bottles in the reverse vending machine at the grocery store.

You can also donate your deposit money to charity!
