Sort More!

We need your help to make recycling easier and more accurate. Here's how to prepare your packaging before recycling it.

- Check the back – it often tells you how it should be sorted.
- Rinse with cold water if needed.
- Empty, flatten, and fold the packaging.
- Sort packaging made from different materials according to the material that weighs the most.

Food waste is placed in the bag provided specifically for it.



YES

Daily newspapers, magazines, catalogues, leaflets, brochures, printer paper, drawing paper, paperbacks.

NO

Paper bags, cartons, gift wrap, plastic-coated paper, envelopes, Post-it notes, hardcover books.



YES

Pasta and cereal packages, pizza boxes, drink cartons, paper bags, cardboard boxes, gift wrap.

NO

Envelopes, Post-it notes, newspapers, flyers.



YES

Bottles, jars and lids made of plastic, plastic bags, refill packs, plastic foil, chip bags, styrofoam, inner bags from cereal boxes and similar.

NO

Non-packaging plastics, plastic toys, plastic buckets, electronics.



YES

Clear glass bottles and glass jars.

NO

Metal lids and screw caps, window and mirror glass, drinking and decorative glasses, crushed glass, porcelain and ceramics, light bulbs, and other light sources.



YES

Colored glass bottles and glass jars.

NO

Metal lids and screw caps, window and mirror glass, drinking and decorative glasses, crushed glass, porcelain and ceramics, light bulbs, and other light sources.



YES

Tin cans, empty spray cans, metal tubes, bottle caps, metal lids, empty paint cans, aluminum foil.

NO

Scrap metal, frying pans, tealight holders, outdoor candle holders, skillets, paint cans and spray cans with contents.



BATTERIES

YES

Small batteries, watch batteries, rechargeable batteries.

NO

Car batteries, electric bike batteries, built-in batteries, battery chargers.




LIGHT BULBS

YES

Light bulbs, low-energy bulbs, LED bulbs, fluorescent tubes shorter than 60 cm.

NO

Fluorescent tubes longer than 60 cm, lamps without a light source (e.g. ceiling and floor lamps), electronics with built-in light sources (e.g. flashlights, LED tealights).



FLUORESCENT TUBES

YES

Fluorescent tubes that are longer than 60 cm.

NO

Incandescent bulbs, low-energy bulbs, LED bulbs, other light sources shorter than 60 cm.



SMALL ELECTRONICS

YES

Mobile phones, electric toothbrushes, electric toys, cords, cables, chargers, computers, printers, household appliances and tools, light fixtures (remove the light source!).

NO

Batteries, car batteries, light bulbs, fluorescent tubes.



COMBUSTIBLE WASTE

YES

Small combustible items (excluding packaging), wood, rubber, binders, plastic-coated paper, broken plastic items.

NO

Materials larger than 75 cm, porcelain, metal, chemicals, paint cans, items that are in good, clean condition.



NON-COMBUSTIBLE WASTE

YES

Small non-combustible items, drinking glasses, mirror glass, porcelain, leather ceramics, tealight holders, skillets, mixed materials (e.g. umbrellas, shovels).

NO

Materials larger than 75 cm, chemicals, white goods, car tires, hazardous waste.

Thank You for Sorting Your Waste!

Together, we can make a difference and keep the recycling room tidy. It's good for both the environment and your wallet.

Sort household waste as food waste or residual waste




YES

Bread, pasta, rice, vegetables, fruit, meat, fish, shellfish, egg-shells, tea leaves, tea bags, coffee grounds, coffee filters, uncolored paper towels.

NO

Dust, wine corks, soil, flowers, cat litter, pet litter, diapers, pads, cigarettes, ash.



YES

Diapers, plaster, tops, wet wipes, napkins, envelopes, Post-it notes, dust, cat litter, pet litter, cigarettes, ash.

NO

Hazardous waste, medicines, packaging, batteries, small electronics, light sources, fluorescent tubes, food waste.

Take this waste to the environmental station, recycling center, pharmacy, or secondhand shops




Hazardous waste such as paint, nail polish, chemicals, solvents, gas tubes, gas cartridges and spray cans with contents must always be left at the environmental station or recycling center.



Pharmaceuticals are taken to the pharmacy. You can sort empty pharmaceutical packaging as usual based on type of material.



Small amounts of cooking oil are wiped off with paper towels and placed in the food waste. Larger quantities are collected in a plastic bottle, milk carton or similar container and taken to the environmental station, recycling center, or placed in residual waste.



Large and heavy items that do not fit in the containers in the recycling room must be left at the recycling center. Please try to reconsider whether it can be donated or reused instead.



Leave whole and clean items that work in the neighborhood exchange room/corner if there is one. Or take to second-hand shops and charitable organizations. Worn-out textiles are taken to an environmental station or recycling center.



Return cans and plastic bottles in the reverse vending machine at the grocery store. You can also donate your deposit money to charity!
